

**San Mateo County Parks Public Meeting

Darshana Greenfield, she/her, Ramaytush Ohlone Land to Everyone There are plenty of other places on City property to put tennis courts and sports fields. It is just not a sustainable idea to cut down old oak trees to put in sports fields that will only serve *some* of our residents. The trees serve all of us. Many, many people want parks to walk and sit in. Many fewer want more ball fields.

Marianne Neuwirth to Everyone How were people notified about the original meetings? I did not know about any of these plans until someone in the park told me about 6 months ago. I have lived about 2 miles from the park for ten years.

Eva Winbush to Everyone Hi, do you track statistics on the visitors at different seasons?

Jeff Phillips to Everyone Love the sports fields and activity areas. What does it mean that the needed funding is already in place?

Leslie Flint to Everyone Aren't you engaging with the public now?!

Melina Gehring to Everyone I second the question "how many native trees?" Particularly: How many oak trees would be sacrificed to the current plan?

David Poeschel to Everyone Good Evening, I'm Dave Poeschel, the Open Space Committee Chair for the Sierra Club Loma Prieta Chapter which represents about 40,000 members and supporters in San Mateo, Santa Clara, and San Benito Counties. We do support active recreation and appreciate the need for ball fields. I myself have spent much of my life playing soccer and still play ultimate Frisbee and understand the competition for playing space. However, you must appreciate the very rare remnant of our natural and cultural history that we have with these few acres of valley floor oak woodland and savanna in Flood Park. Before the California Goldrush, nearly all these lands from the bay wetlands to the Santa Cruz Mountains, the whole of the Santa Clara Valley were oak woodlands and savanna. We've done a fair job of protecting the mountains, but today Flood Park and few acres of the Guadalupe Oak Grove Park in San Jose is almost all that is left of these magnificent oak woodlands. Please understand, oaks are very slow growing.

Wendy Shindler to Everyone Evening,

Susan Lessin to Everyone Can the soccer field be moved in the southern part of the park to preserve the woodland of the park?

Ron to Everyone I feel that sports fields be kept in the sports field side of the park. Parks has constantly stated "Preservation of trees" as top priority. A sports field in the woodland destroys trees. Can we keep and preserve the woodland and keep sports on the sports side of the park

Julie Hartstein to Everyone Can you provide more details on budget sources and timeline for phases?

David Poeschel to Everyone Many of the oaks, including some slated for removal, were here in the park when James Flood first purchased this land with his Goldrush wealth. This natural and historical resource is simply irreplaceable. Please honor your pledge for the land acknowledgement of these once indigenous lands. Community building can be encouraged by protecting this natural resource and enhancing it with native plant and oak tree restoration for the next several centuries. Unfortunately, as housing densification occurs as directed with SB 9, the canopy of oaks on private residential properties will decline. Our natural resources in public parks will only become more precious in the coming century. Please prioritize the cultural and natural history of these old coast live oak, valley oak, and California bay trees. Thank You

Sarah to Everyone I did not hear you mention anything about preserving the trees including the heritage trees - the sacred lands. Carla mentioned honoring the Ohlone peoples... how is this going to be done. I am gravely concerned about #16 multi-use sport field which is smack in the middle of the heritage tree grove. How can you possibly not impact these beautiful trees and the animals that reside here? This question needs to be answered.

Michael Murphy to Everyone Trees don't have to be "heritage" trees to be worth saving. The woodland is a complete ecosystem with young and old trees.

Wendy Shindler to Everyone Please describe a typical day in the new park from opening to closing.

Marianne Neuwirth to Everyone Who did the county reach out to for feedback? I would like to add my voice to my concern about removing so many trees. The plan seems to shift the balance toward sports a bit too much. I'd prefer to have the sports areas moved to the areas already slated for them, and keep the trees. Thank you for the opportunity to offer our input.

Nettie Wiisman to Everyone You say you are committed to maintaining the quantity and capacity of picnic facilities, one of the most used facilities now. You say you will control the park use through scheduling of the reservable picnic sites, adobe structure and fields. Data from the 2019 EIR showed picnic use was decreased by 70%. Are you going to allow equal use of the reservable picnic facilities with the reservable sports fields which are usually scheduled far in advance.

GG Films to Everyone I concur with Marianne N. comment.

Naomi Goodman to Everyone There is a huge need for soccer fields, but that use is not compatible with other uses. Stray balls, noise, spectators will impinge on nearby picnic areas and those who come to enjoy nature. In addition, either a grass field or turf field is likely to damage the trees that remain. Oaks require absence of summer watering and will have a high risk of root rot if they are adjacent to watered turf. Soil compaction from bystanders and fill will also put those heritage trees at risk.

Charlottemuse to Everyone My concern is that this park is one of the few that is not focused entirely on organized sports. Please keep the sense of peace and beauty that the woodland provides.

Darshana Greenfield, she/her, Ramaytush Ohlone Land to Everyone I was caring for my father in hospice for all of the end of 2015 and 2016 - I never heard about you seeking input until 2020, when I heard the plan was done.

One would think a project that proposes to cut down a portion of the last remaining oak woodland in the Bay area would require environmental impact review. Didn't the development of the Seminary property require an EIR before it was approved? Perhaps the county doesn't have to get an EIT because it is already the owner of this property which is already a public park so no use change is occurring, but an EIR would still be appropriate because these trees are an irreplaceable environmental resource and converting the woodland to soccer fields is, in fact, a use change. The county should not proceed to cut oak forest without an EIR.
